Respuesta modelo:

- 1) Describe: The first image shows a bustling traditional market, with stalls of fresh produce and customers browsing and chatting. The second shows someone shopping online from the comfort of their sofa, using a phone.
- 2) Compare: The key difference is the human element. A market is sociable and great for fresh, local food, whereas online shopping wins on sheer convenience and choice, though it can feel rather impersonal.
- 3) Speculate: Looking ahead, I'd expect online shopping to keep growing, especially with faster delivery. That said, I suspect physical markets will survive, precisely because people value the experience and the contact.

Respuesta modelo:

Technology has completely transformed the way we communicate. Not long ago, we relied on letters and landline calls; now we have instant messaging, video calls and social media at our fingertips. The advantages are considerable. Communication is faster, cheaper and more global than ever, which means I can stay in close contact with friends and family abroad almost effortlessly. It has also given a voice to people who would never have been heard before. However, there's a clear downside. Many of us now spend so long on our screens that genuine face-to-face contact suffers, and text messages can easily be misread without tone of voice. Looking to the future, I imagine communication will become even more immersive, with video and perhaps virtual reality taking over. Even so, I firmly believe that nothing will ever fully replace a real conversation in person.

Respuesta modelo:

On the whole, I'm in favour of making public transport free, although I recognise it's not without its challenges. The strongest argument is environmental. If buses and trains cost nothing, far more people would leave their cars at home, easing both congestion and pollution in our cities. There's also a powerful social case: everyone needs to get to work or college, and free transport would be a real lifeline for those on lower incomes. Admittedly, the obvious objection is cost; the money would have to come from taxation, and not everyone would accept that. However, I'd argue the long-term benefits, cleaner air, less traffic and a fairer society, would more than justify the expense. All things considered, I believe it's an investment well worth making.
