### Respuesta modelo:

- 1) I'm firmly in favour of pedestrianising the centre. Done well, it would slash traffic and pollution while reclaiming the streets for people, and towns that have taken the plunge tend to flourish as a result.
- 2) The shopkeepers' anxieties are understandable, but I'd gently push back: research repeatedly shows footfall and spending rise once an area becomes pleasant to linger in. Decent parking on the fringes would address their worries.
- 3) My one caveat concerns public transport. Removing cars only works if it's matched by genuinely frequent, reliable buses; otherwise we risk cutting off the elderly and less mobile, which would be indefensible.

I would be grateful if you could arrange a public consultation before anything is finalised, so that residents' voices are genuinely heard.

More Than Words: Why Learning a Language Changes You

We tend to frame language learning in narrowly practical terms, a line on a CV, a holiday survival kit. Yet to reduce it to that is to miss the point entirely, because its real value runs far deeper.

The practical rewards are real enough. A second language opens up career opportunities and turns travel from passive sightseeing into genuine encounter. But the more profound benefits are quieter. A growing body of research links bilingualism to sharper memory, better focus and even a measurable delay in cognitive decline. In other words, the sustained effort quite literally reshapes the brain for the better, and the gains accrue at any age.

Most striking of all, though, is what a language does to your perspective. Each one encodes a distinct way of carving up the world, and inhabiting it, however imperfectly, cultivates the kind of empathy and open-mindedness our divided times badly need.

So set aside the tired notion that you're 'no good at languages'. Start modestly, stay curious, and make peace with the inevitable mistakes. More often than not, the journey itself turns out to be the real reward.
